


NOTEBOOK



STEP I



Print the colored or black and white versions of the interactive ABC Notebook. Glue the cover to the notebook prior to students use-or have students cut and glue it to their notebook.

STEP 2



On the first page of the notebook glue the ABC Ticket page. As the children learn a new letter they will glue the "I Know the Letter" page into their notebook. When they can identify a letter have them glue the "Rock On" page into their book and the small ticket on the ABC Tickets page.



STEP 3



Print the colored or black and white versions of the letter unit prior to the first activity if you plan to use the letters in order.

STEP 4

Choose one of the activities below to use with your students. You can set the notebook up in the way that works best for you. Introduce the letters in alphabetical order or mix them up as you see fit.
